



Youth Perspectives on Governance in Indonesia.

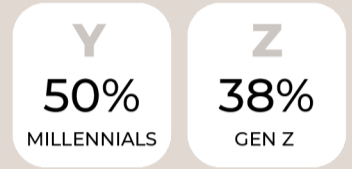


Indonesian youth report moderate trust in their government, with concerns over corruption and a lack of transparency.

More than **2 in 5 Indonesian Youths.**

Trust their government to act in the best interest of the public.

Postgrads are more likely to have trust.
64% vs 44% among Bachelor's degree and below.



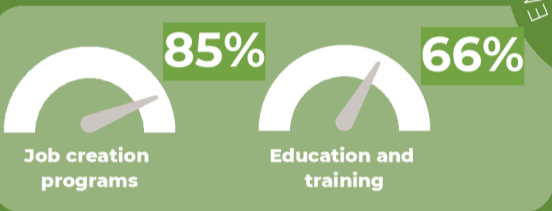
Gen Z is more skeptical of the government acting in their interests.



Job creation programs are the top priority for improvement.



Youth in Indonesia believe government job creation has been insufficient. They are most worried about **unemployment** and **skills mismatch**.



Gen Zs are more likely to prioritize employment services.
76% Gen Z vs 65% Millennials

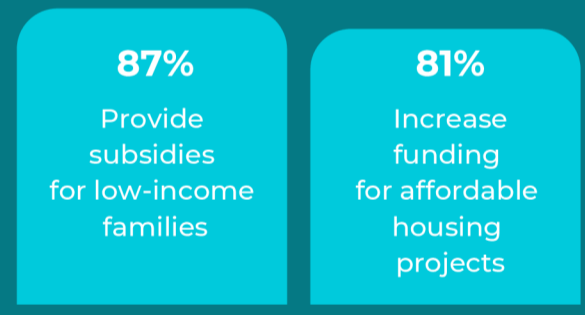


Their primary concern around employment challenges.

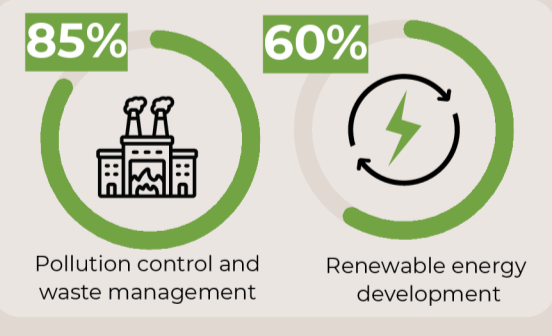

Environmental issues like **deforestation** and **pollution** are critical for Indonesian youth, who are calling for greater environmental protections.



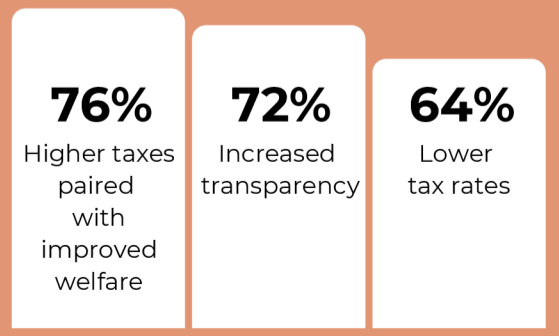
PRIORITY AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT
