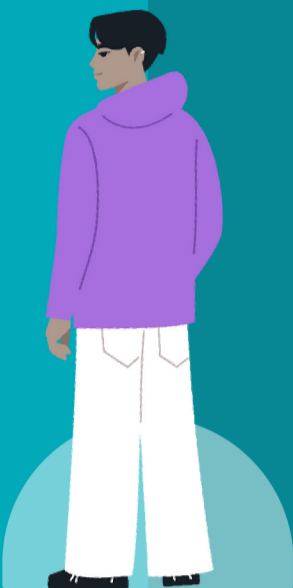


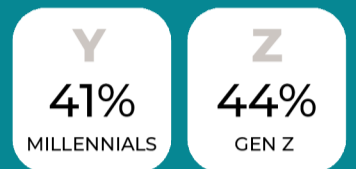
Youth Perspectives on Governance in Malaysia.



Youth in Malaysia express moderate levels of trust in the government, with concerns primarily around a lack of transparency and the effectiveness of government policies.



More than **2 in 5** Malaysians trust the government to act in the best interest of the public.



Postgrads are more likely to have trust **61%** vs **39%** among Bachelor's degree and below.

Malaysians are satisfied with job security in Malaysia.

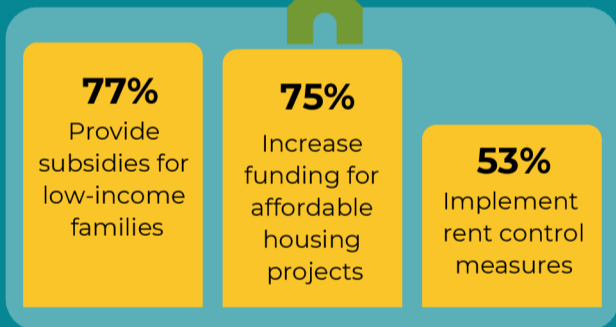


PRIORITY AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT

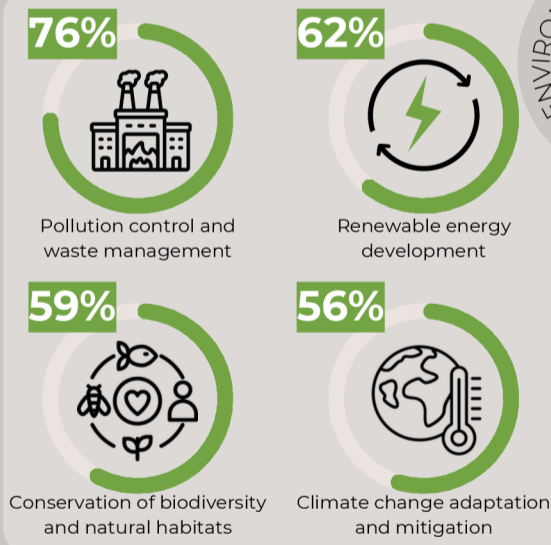
Youth in Malaysia are particularly worried about job opportunities and job security, citing the lack of opportunities and skills mismatch as major concerns.



Housing affordability remains a challenge for Youth across Malaysia, with rental and purchase prices being significant concerns. Youth prioritize subsidies for low-income families and increased funding for affordable housing.

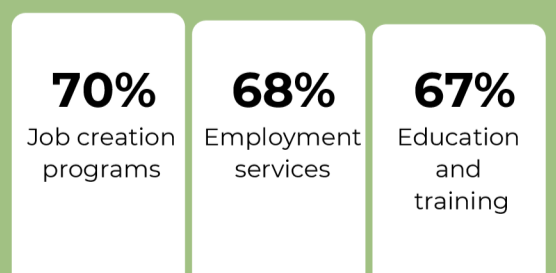
Malaysian Youth are increasingly concerned about environmental issues, emphasizing pollution control, renewable energy, and biodiversity conservation.

Malaysian Youth are calling for tax reform, focusing on lowering tax rates and increasing transparency in how the tax system is managed. Both Gen Z and Millennials cite high tax rates as a major concern.

2 in 5 Malaysians express dissatisfaction with the current tax system.
